About the Conference

Outlined by the 33 sections and working groups, the IAMCR conference 2023 covers a broad diversity of topics, proposing an individual central theme to be explored throughout the conference with the aim of producing and pursuing diverse perspectives on a shared set of issues. Three days prior to the start of the conference, academics, scholars, and researchers will have the chance to come together in Grenoble, Montpellier, or Lyon, participating in one of this year's 10 pre-conferences. These pre-conferences provide an exemplary prelude to the conference itself, exploring a variety of subjects, such as climate, journalism, media, and communication. Sunday, July 9th then begins the 2023 Conference, which will include four plenaries, 16 partner and special sessions, and numerous parallel sessions of our sections and working groups. The IAMCR 2023's central theme is Inhabiting the planet: Challenges for media, communication and beyond.

The 2023 IAMCR Conference encompasses two core questions which constitute its foundation: What does it mean to be human in a digital world? What does it mean to build a common future?

Incorporating the premonitions of various alternative media outlets, militant communities, opinion leaders (Wallace-Wells, 2019), philosophers and scholars (Morin, 2011; Latouche, 2016; Bourg et al, 2020), the conference will explore climate change's permanent consequences which have the power to render the planet inhabitable. Cultural conflicts and political tensions, the disappearance of natural resources, and foreseeable health crises will be analyzed as well. Turning however towards the future, the conference also incorporates voices articulating trust in technology's prospective contributions (Rifkin, 2011, 2014).

Combining these apprehensions with a belief in the future allows the conference to broach the key problematics of the digitalization of society and the technological transformation of nature, which require socio-political debate and governance (Feenberg, 1999, 2002). IAMCR 2023 grants the international society of media and communication scholars and researchers the opportunity to deliberate the diverse challenges associated with five pertinent themes: humanity and progress; democracy; media, information, and communication; cities and territories; and environmental accountability.

Within the realm of technological progress, the domains of computer science, engineering and medicine have brought numerous accomplishments. Accompanying these successes is a multitude of questions, pertaining to the logic of scientific innovations and its dialectics with society. These queries provide an opportunity for exploration, questioning the durability of society's democracy and addressing the issue of democratic political action in a global world, which are all crucial aims of the conference.



Through the lens of media and communication, digitalization has introduced several challenges predicted to complicate the future of society. The conference will address these historical and contemporary challenges specifically linked to industries and their economic models, expectations, practices, and societal status, throughout an obscure and rapidly maturing context.

Regarding cities and territories, the underlying question examined by the conference is "Will the 21st century be urban?" These studies include the questioning of three applicable characteristics: smart, sustainable, and creative cities, which each profoundly impact the urban ecosystem and its association with urban territories. The conference intends to investigate the role of state actors and the framework of national interventions which enforce restrictions, but which in turn allow for citizen representation through participation.

Finally, the 2023 IAMCR Lyon Conference aspires to accentuate the necessity of individual and collective environmental responsibility. Academics will highlight the influential impacts of reducing consumption of energy and natural resources, demonstrating the profound significance of not only their research but of actions exhibited by humanity, emphasizing each individual's essential role in protecting our planet.

An Environmentally Friendly Congress

The logistics of the IAMCR Lyon 2023 Conference have been designed by the LOC to be as sustainable and as respectful as possible, linked directly to the theme Inhabiting the Planet. We warn delegates that no bottles of water will be distributed but that water fountains will be available throughout the Rockefeller site, so remember to bring your own water bottle. Lunch will be in the form of lunch boxes, with vegetarian options, and delegates will only receive one set of cutlery, which they must keep for all subsequent lunches. Any undamaged and leftover food will be shared between volunteers and a charity with which the LOC has made arrangements. No air conditioning will be used, and no goodies or tote bags will be distributed to attendees to avoid increasing the number of our plastic and disposable objects, which contribute greatly to pollution. Free WIFI access will be available on-site for all participants¹. Virtual participation in the conference is possible, and all plenary sessions will be recorded for online viewing. Finally, the congress program will not be printed and will not be available in paper format; it will instead be available on the conference website in responsive formats to allow downloading or consultation.

Opening Ceremony / Sunday July 9th - 4:30 PM

At 4:30pm on Sunday afternoon this year's opening ceremony begins at University Claude Bernard Lyon 1's Rockefeller campus, located in Lyon 8th district. Built in 1930 by a student of Tony Garnier's, Paul Bellemain, the Rockefeller Campus is composed of six buildings including the Faculty of Medicine Lyon East, the Institute of Pharmaceutical and Biological Sciences (ISPB), and the Institute of Rehabilitation Sciences and Techniques (ISTR).

As the subject of a large architectural, technical, and heritage study in 2011, the estate's simultaneous renovations led to the discovery of several details dating back to the 1930s. Today, the original building has been restored, with the addition of a few modern touches. Its acoustic capacities, natural and artificial light, ventilation, and accessibility make Rockefeller an ideal location for this year's conference, the first in-person edition since 2019. The ceremony will begin with words of welcome and the 2023 congress's first opening plenary session, with a cocktail reception to follow.



Conference dinner / Wednesday July 12th - 8 PM

At 8pm on Wednesday evening, the 12th of July, the conference dinner will be held at the Musée des Confluences. Situated at the confluence of the Rhône and Saône rivers, the museum serves as a monument at the merging of two paths, symbolic of unity and openness towards global perspectives. Having opened on December 20th, 2014, the museum will celebrate its ninth anniversary this year. Its architectural concept, developed by the Austrian agency Coop Himmelb(I)au, pays tribute to the idea of building a bridge between constructed elements and nature. From the outside, the museum takes the shape of a crystal cloud made of glass and stainless steel, floating in the air. Inside are the natural history and anthropology exhibits, with works of art surrounding the themes of society and civilisation. Centred around the questions pertaining to human origin and the future of diversity, the museum has put in place four permanent exhibitions in the hopes of revealing unknown ways of understanding the sheer complexity of the world. Along with access to the soirée de gala event, congress attendees who have registered for the conference dinner will have the opportunity to visit two of these ongoing exhibitions, "Nous les Fleuves" and "Afrique, Milles Vies d'Objets".

IAMCR 2023 Opening Plenary Keynote Sunday, July 9th, 2023 / 5:00-7:00PM Amphitheatres A, B, C

Humanity, Alienation, and (In)Justice in the Digital Age Christian FUCHS

Abstract

This talk asks and deals with the following question: How can we understand and explain the challenges humanity is facing today in the light of digitalisation?

First, the speaker argues that we need a critical theory of communication and society and that such a theory can in a feasible manner be based on insights from, updates and the further development of approaches that come from a variety of approaches in critical thought, theory, and philosophy. The presenter advances an approach to research that stands in the tradition of Critical Political Economy of Communication and combines critical theory, critical empirical social research, and critical ethics. In this context, the notions of radical (digital) humanism, social production, work, injustice as alienation, domination, exploitation, social struggles, media/communication/digital (in)justice, and democratic socialism/socialist democracy play an important role.

Second, the talk discusses the question: In what kind of societies do we live? It outlines some aspects of the notion of digital capitalism and compares it to other concepts such as the network society (Castells), surveillance capitalism (Zuboff), and platform capitalism (Srnicek).



Third, the talk will present aspects of specific case studies that deal with questions of humanity, (in)justice, and democracy in the digital age. The discussed cases will include the digital mediation of labour in the context of COVID-19; a critique of big data-based computational social science research methods; reflections on trends in academic publishing and open access publishing in the age of digital capitalism; digital violence; and the digital commons. All of these and other cases pose in one way or another the question: How have humanity and the role of humans in society been transformed in the digital age?



Fourth, the presentation will engage with the question of what alternatives there are to the explosion of a variety of forms of (digital) injustice and (digital) alienation that we are experiencing throughout the world today and what role communication and digitalisation play in this context. A key question in this context is how to organise communications, media systems, and the Internet in a just manner.

Christian Fuchs is Chair Professor of Media Systems and Media Organisation at Paderborn University's Department of Media Studies. Prior to taking up this position, he was Professor of Media, Communication & Society and Professor of Social Media at the University of Westminster. He is editor of the open access media and communication studies journal <u>tripleC: Communication</u>, <u>Capitalism & Critique</u> and was involved in founding the open access publishing house <u>University of Westminster Press</u>. Together with Klaus Unterberger (Austrian Broadcasting Corporation), Fuchs <u>initiated</u> the Public Service Media and Public Service Internet <u>Manifesto</u>.

His research and teaching are focused on the Critical Political Economy of Communication; the critical theory of communication and society; and digital media and society. Among his books are Media, Economy, and Society: A Critical Introduction; Social Media: A Critical Introduction; Digital Democracy and the Digital Public Sphere; Digital Ethics; Digital Humanism: A Philosophy for 21st Century Digital Society; Digital Fascism; Digital Capitalism; Foundations of Critical Theory; Communicating COVID-19: Everyday Life, Digital Capitalism and Conspiracy Theories in Pandemic Times; Marxist Humanism and Communication Theory; Marxism: Karl Marx's Fifteen Key Concepts for Cultural & Communication Studies; Nationalism on the Internet; Digital Demagogue; Critical Theory of Communication; Reading Marx in the Information Age; Digital Labour and Karl Marx; OccupyMedia!; Culture and Economy in the Age of Social Media; Internet and Society. <u>http://fuchsc.net</u>, @fuchschristian

Plenary Session Monday, July 10th, 2023 10:30-12:30 - Amphitheatres A, B, C.

International communication: On the Significance of Borders in the Digital Borderless World

This plenary session will discuss the paradoxical role of the media and communication technologies, which are both tools for crossing and for erecting (symbolic) borders. As this panel will explore to what extent borders remain key categories for understanding the realities of transnational flows in digital times, it will address such issues as: the ways in which, in this so-called borderless world, an increasing number of governments use all the means at their disposal to protect themselves against what they regard as being harmful digital transnational flows, and build new barriers against them; how social media, but also traditional media play a key role in the building of symbolic boundaries between "us" and "them", or are used as instruments to fuel hatred between communities; how digital technologies constitute major components of the new walls that are erected by governments or international organizations for stemming transnational migration flows...

Words, sounds or images have never been so able to cross borders and have never circulated so rapidly, at an international scale. This is at least what the optimistic accounts on transnational connections in digital times suggest. These accounts tend, however, to neglect a series of obstacles that hinder these connections. Beyond, media and technologies are far from contributing only to the disruption of borders. On the contrary, they also actively contribute to the building of new kinds of physical or symbolic borders. It is this paradox of media and communication technologies being both tools for crossing or for erecting borders that will be discussed in this panel.



Moderator:

Tristan Mattelart is professor of International Communication at the French Institute of the Press, University Paris-Panthéon-Assas, and researcher at the Centre for Interdisciplinary Analysis and Research of the Media (CARISM). Currently, he studies the ways in which global digital platforms reconfigure the transnational circulation of news and cultural products.

Yu Hong is a professor of Communication at the College of Media and International Culture, Zhejiang University. She studies ICT4D, internet and media policy, digital capitalism, the politics of mediation, and shifting global communication order, with a focus on China. Her recent projects include a Chinese-language monograph on states and the cybersphere.



Daya Thussu is professor of International Communication at Hong Kong Baptist University. For many years, he was professor of International Communication at the University of Westminster in London. He is the author or editor of 20 books and founder and Managing Editor of the journal Global Media and Communication.



Stefania Milan (<u>stefaniamilan.net</u>) works at the intersection of participation, technology, and governance, with emphasis on infrastructure and agency. She is Professor of Critical Data Studies at the University of Amsterdam, affiliated with the Berkman Klein Center for Internet & Society (Harvard University) and the School of Transnational Governance (European University Institute).

Herman Wasserman is professor and chair of the Department of Journalism, Stellenbosch University, South Africa. He has published widely on media in Africa, journalism ethics, and disinformation in the Global South. He is Editor-in-Chief of the journals African Journalism Studies and the Annals of the International Communication, and Associate Editor of Communication Theory and International Communication Gazette.



Plenary Panel Session Tuesday, July 11th, 2023 10:30-12:30 - Amphitheatres A, B, C

The contribution of academia to peace-building: Critique, creativity and activism

This plenary panel aims to discuss what academics can and should do to facilitate our peaceful inhabiting the planet. What academic strategies, practices and identities are desirable or necessary for this purpose? What are the risks and opportunities for deploying them, and how can we strengthen and diversify academia's contribution to peace-building?

Throughout history, academia has taken a multiplicity of positions in relation to conflict. The critical study of violent conflict has a long history, but academic activism and academic diplomacy in relation to violent conflict also have a substantial history. Moreover, action research, used also in conflict-affected societal contexts, incorporates a similar interventionist dimension. The omnipresence of violence on the society/community scale and its intense traumatic impacts necessitate our continued attention. This plenary panel aims to discuss what academics can/should do to facilitate our peaceful inhabiting the planet and what academic strategies, practices and identities are desirable or necessary for this.

Communication for Sustainable Societies in the Anthropocene – the role of scholars and media industries Annika EGAN SJÖLANDER

Abstract:

This closing keynote returns to the overall theme of the conference, "Inhabiting the planet", in order to engage in a dialogue about its challenging meaning for us as media and communication scholars today and in the future. Taking it seriously requires us to not only revise, but to profoundly re-work multiple boundaries and hierarchies in our own mundane knowledge production. This is not only a task for environmental communication scholars. The strong focus on social or societal dimensions is only one example. The habit of dividing humans from what we call nature is another, including the problematic hierarchy this distinction generally entails.

The role of media industries, a prime topic in our field, will also be discussed. They form parts of the commons in the Anthropocene and are therefore crucial when promoting much needed 'just' social change. At the same time, media industries themselves contribute in complex ways to the unprecedented environmental problems we face today, such as the climate crisis or biodiversity loss. The need for "greening the media" (Maxwell and Miller, 2012) has never been stronger.

Communication for sustainable societies in the Anthropocene, the title of this talk, points at the need for systematic and context-specific knowledge, both theoretical and empirical, about the role of media and communication when it comes to transformation(s) towards sustainability. Understanding "place" better, including global/local links and conflicts, is important. This will be exemplified with the case of emerging Climate Neutral Cities promoted by the EU Green Deal and the "green revolution" taking place in the Swedish North, all motivated by the climate crisis. Climate journalism and citizen dialogues in different places about this "green transition" are both key communication practices with democratic impact that ultimately influence societies' ability to change.



About the speaker:



Annika Egan Sjölander is Professor and Chair in Media and Communication Studies at Umeå University, Sweden where she also leads the Umeå Transformation Research Initiative (UTRI), a cross-faculty network of researchers with an interest in transformation(s) towards sustainability. 


SPECIAL SESSION Introducing the Handbook of Media and Culture in the Middle East: Implications for Area Studies Research and **Publication**

Recent evidence on the state of mental health among academics paints an alarming picture. Faculty members and PhD students around the world run a high risk of developing mental health issues, including anxiety, depression, and burnout, at some point in their career. The structural conditions of academic work, such as high publication pressure, fierce competition, and a culture of constant evaluation, may well contribute to the problem; and the pandemic has clearly intensified it. Based on a worldwide survey of media and communication scholars (n = 1028), the panel presents evidence on the mental health situation of academics in our field. 
